**The Wenatchee River Institute requests funds to support a  
firewise landscaping demonstration project**

City of Leavenworth funds would pay for the firewise work: cutting down and limbing trees, removing/chipping small diameter trees and understory. The Wenatchee River Institute would pay for the associated signs, brochures, and curriculum.

Project goals:

1. educate local citizens about how to firewise their own properties
2. teach students about the importance of fire prevention and defensible space
3. educate out-of-town visitors about living with wildfire
4. help protect the City from a potential fire

We have four possible project sites to be funded (in prioritized order):

Site #1: E. Lorene Young House	\$10,000 - \$12,000
Site #2: Downstream of E. Lorene Young House	\$4,000
Site #3: Behind the Red Barn	\$2,000
Site #4: Between Red Barn and Barn Beach	\$2,000

City funds could be for all or a portion of these sites. The signs, brochures, and curriculum developed by WRI would depend on the number of sites improved.

**Funding for any or all of these projects would be appreciated.**

## Priority Site #1: E. Lorene Young House

The E. Lorene Young House sits on a lot filled with huge conifers - dead, not healthy and leaning, and some with limbs that overhang and touch the house. While some firewise work has been done on the outside of the house, no work has been done on the surrounding property.

- Parcel 241712676145
- .5 acres
- Work to be done:
  - Remove 5-6 dead trees near the house
  - Remove a tree leaning over the PeaVine Trail
  - Limb the large trees
  - Remove limbs overhanging/touching the house roof
- Estimated cost: \$10,000 - \$12,000



## Priority Site #2: Three lots downstream of E. Lorene Young

These lots have not had any firewise work done. There is at least one homeless campsite. A small fire started there this summer.

- Parcels 241712676190, 241712676815, 241712120050
- 1.75 acres
- Work to be done:
  - Remove/chip small trees and understory
- Estimated cost: \$4,000 (difficult access)
- Eligible for cost share through DNR.



### Priority Site #3: Behind the Red Barn

This summer a volunteer crew spent a day removing small diameter trees and understory on this property. There is still more work to be done. This property adjoins the downtown and residences.

- Parcels 241712676080 and 241712662510
- Acreage: .75 acres
- Finish removal/chipping of small trees and understory
- Estimated cost: \$2,000 (difficult access)
- Eligible for cost share through DNR



## Priority Project #4: Between the Red Barn and Barn Beach

While this is a large property (1.75 acres), it is the property immediately adjacent to the PeaVine Trail that needs treatment and is most at risk of a fire from someone walking the trail with a cigarette.

- Parcel 241712120150 and
- Acreage: approximately 1 acre requires treatment
- Remove/chip small trees and understory
- Estimated cost: \$2,000
- Eligible for cost share through DNR.



## Accomplished to date:

- **Chumstick Wildfire Stewardship Coalition:** in 2016 WRI had firewise home assessments done for the River Haus, Red Barn, and E. Lorene Young House. WRI has been slowly resolving the identified issues.
- **Department of Natural Resources:** met with Cyndia Tonasket to confirm WRI is eligible for their cost share program for removal of small diameter trees and understory
- **Cascade Conservation District:** participated in their chipping program every fall and spring
- **WRI volunteers:** did firewise work behind Barn. Not completed.
- **WRI:** removed two hazard trees at a cost of \$9,000
- **Chelan County Fire District 3:** met with Deputy Fire Chief Dave Nalle to get firewise advice
- **Wildfire Home Protection:** got a bid for firewise work behind the Barn
- **City of Leavenworth:** contacted Lilith about tree removal in a flood zone
- **Leavenworth Rotary:** submitted a formal request they take WRI firewise work as a Rotary community project

## Other outreach:

- **Chumstick Wildfire Stewardship Coalition:** arranged a “trade” where CWSC would use the Red Barn for in exchange for some firewise work. COVID cancelled these plans.
- **Cascade Conservation District:** talked with them about funding opportunities
- **Chelan County Natural Resources Department:** talked with them about funding opportunities
