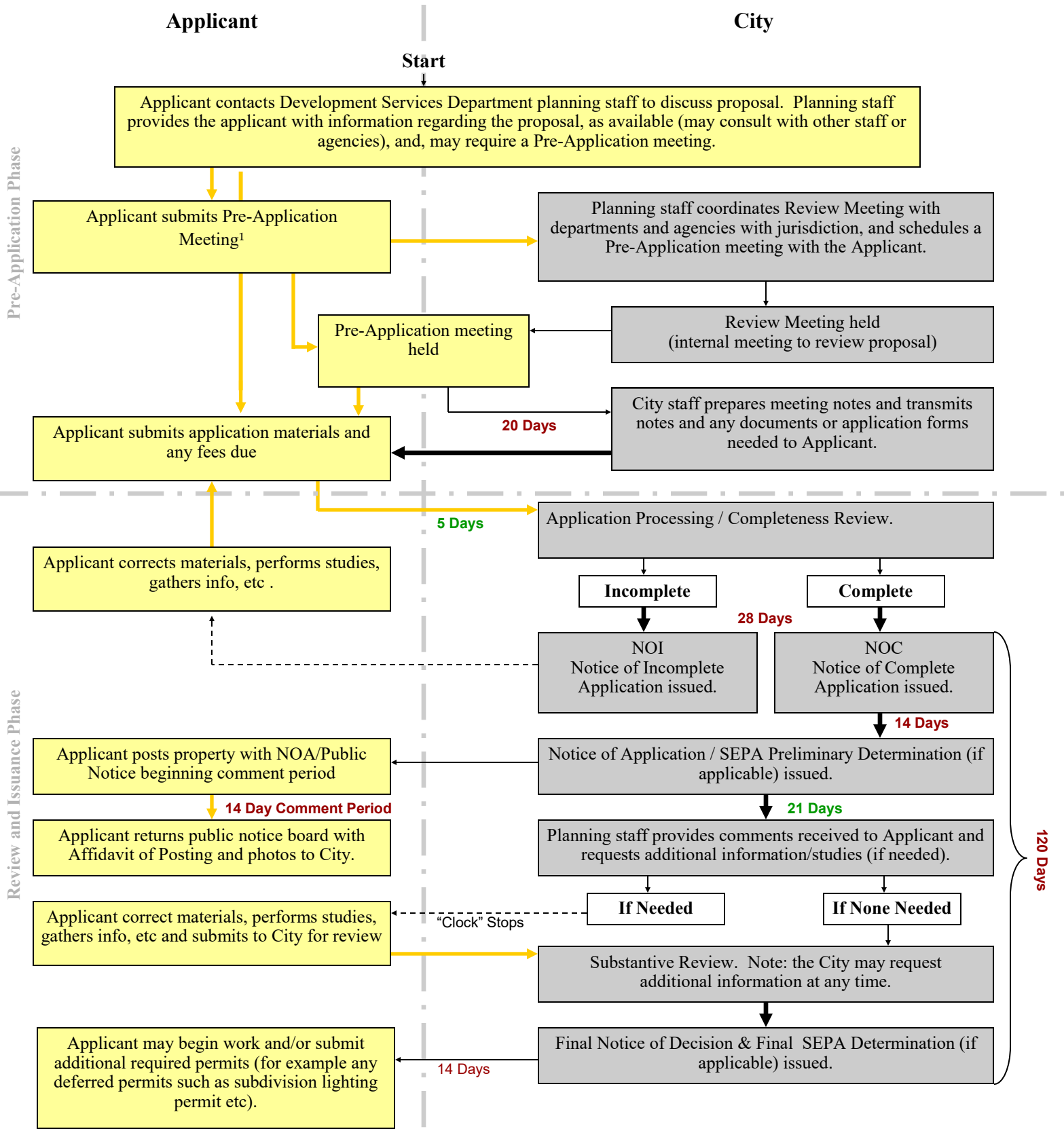




Full-Administrative Review of Applications

The full administrative review process is used when a proposed development is subject to the objective and subjective standards that require the exercise of limited discretion about nontechnical issues and about which there may be limited public interest. The proposed development may or may not be subject to State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) review. This type of review includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- Short subdivisions; Binding Site Plans;
- Group B home occupations;
- Shoreline Substantial Development Permits;
- Multifamily, commercial, industrial, and/or office building permits that have not been subject to a public review process or for which environmental review has not been completed in connection with other project permits.
